C. Kemper provided an overview of the Library's political organization, discussing the Library's existence as an independent political sub-division and taxing jurisdiction. He discussed the Library's financial situation, including the impact of tax abatements and the current tax protests on the Library's budget. He explained the ethnic diversity within the Library District and the Library's support of the community.

J. Kemper discussed the roll of the Board of Trustees at the Kansas City Public Library. He encouraged the new Board members to review the financial information provided by the Library. He stated that the role of the Board of Trustees is to think long term about the interests and needs of the Library and the community. He noted that the Library Trustees serve the length of their respective terms, and not at the pleasure of the mayoral system that appointed them.
